

De Gruyter Mouton: Submission Guidelines for Book Proposals

Prior to submitting a proposal, authors and editors are encouraged to browse our book series and to suggest which series they think their book will fit into. A list of all book series can be found [here](#) and further below.

Once you have identified one or more suitable book series, then please contact **Birgit Sievert** (general and theoretical linguistics) or **Natalie Fecher** (applied linguistics & communication science) for further guidance.

For all other submissions, please submit a proposal including the following information:

- 1) Title of the proposed book
- 2) Names and affiliation of each volume author/editor
- 3) Brief explanation of what the book is about and why the topic is of theoretical and methodological importance
- 4) Proposed structure of the book along with a brief summary of each chapter
- 5) Brief narrative CV of each volume author/editor
- 6) Brief description of the target audience/proposed market
- 7) Brief description of any similar or competing publications on the market
- 8) Estimated length of the book (typically 250-350 pages, with ~500 words/page)
- 9) Predicted timeline for delivery of the first draft of the manuscript
- 10) Optional: Names and affiliation of up to three potential reviewers

Depending on the type of manuscript, the following information should additionally be provided:

- **Monographs:** Summary of the central research question(s) addressed (if not provided above)
- **Edited volumes:** Abstracts for all contributions and the names of authors who have agreed or will be invited to contribute; the final manuscript should include an introduction by the volume editor(s) providing a general background of the book and highlighting any features connecting contributions; note that overseeing the chapter peer review is the responsibility of the volume editor(s)
- **PhD dissertations/theses:** The original manuscript; the supervisors' reports, if available; a detailed description of how the thesis will be revised for publication as a book
- **Textbooks:** Detailed information about the type of courses for which the book will be used; note that textbooks will be considered only if they will likely be used by a large number of students

De Gruyter Mouton may ask you to provide additional information not listed here (e.g., a sample chapter).

All book proposals are subject to extensive peer review by the series editors (if applicable) and/or by one or more external reviewers. Publishing contracts will be issued upon acceptance of the final, revised proposal.
